## When can my newborn baby come to the nursery?

Families can bring their babies to the nursery at 2 months after they have received their first round of immunizations.

## Illness and Medications

A child who APPEARS ILL or has been ill in the preceding 24 hours cannot be accepted in a preschool department. This is for the protection of your child, the other children and the teachers.

Recommendations taken from the report of the Committee on Control of Infectious Diseases of The American Academy of Pediatrics.

A child should not be taken from the home when any of the following exists:

Fever, vomiting and/or diarrhea, any symptom of the usual childhood diseases- German measles, scarlet fever, mumps, chicken pox, and whooping cough  
common cold, colored nasal discharge, sore throat, croup, any unexplained rash, any skin infection, pink eye and other eye infections

Children who appear ill during a church session will be isolated and the parent notified.

Should your child contract a childhood disease following a preschool session, please contact the Minister of Preschool Education so that other parents can be notified.

Teachers are not permitted to give medication to any child.

## Suggestions for Parents

Bring your child to church regularly. This will help them develop consistency and contribute to participation.

Talk to your child about church and the happy experiences there. When you leave him tell him kindly and firmly that you will return for him.

Avoid rushing your child into the departments prior to services or meetings.

Children should be called for immediately at the close of each session. Sometimes even the most well adjusted child will become fearful or anxious if he is left after the other boys and girls have gone.

Include your child in your family worship at home.
